PART IV. AGREEMENT TO ACCEPT THE RULES AND PROCEDURES OF THE MUSEUM

The New Mexico Legislature similarly has enacted the Indian Arts and Crafts Sales Act, Section 30-33-1 et. seq. NMSA (1978) mandating that no person sell crafts claimed to be handcrafted by American Indians when in fact the materials and process are not genuine.

Part IV of this application requires that you read the rules and procedures of the Museum of New Mexico and the Indian Arts and Crafts Sales Act. You may not begin selling at the Portal until your application has been approved by the Museum.
